Summer Reading Activities

After reading, decide which book you want to do a project on. Every student is required to complete **one activity** from the list below to show his/her comprehension of the book he/she chose. Remember to **use the rubric** to see what you need to include in your project for the best grade.

Due date: Thursday and Friday, August 18 & 19, 2011

- Create a tri-fold storyboard. The storyboard should include the following elements: title, author, main characters, setting, summary, the author's purpose, and the tone/mood.
- Build a miniature stage setting of a scene in the book. Include a written or typed explanation of the scene. ½-page to a 1-page paper.
- Think about the most important parts in the story. Create a comic book. Include pictures and dialogues. Make it colorful.
- Dress like your favorite character in the story. Write or type a 1-page to 2-page paper describing your favorite character. Ideas to include in your paper are the characteristics, the character's personality, how the character feels about the problem in the story, what the character likes/dislikes, etc.
- Create an 8-inch or bigger sculpture of a character in the story. Use any combination of soap, wood, clay, sticks, wire, old toy pieces, or any other object. A 1-page to 1 ½-page explanation of how this character fits into the book should accompany the sculpture.
