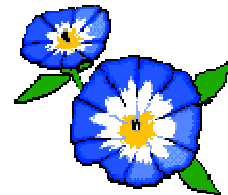

Teach counting and number concepts. Classification and opposites. Matching and dot-to-dot.

Recognizing colors and shapes. Students will use different techniques to help them to sharp their visual perceptions such as; tracing, matching, cutting and comparing.
